Aída Hernández is Professor and Senior Researcher at CIESAS, the Center for Research and Advanced Studies in Social Anthropology in Mexico City. One of her projects involves exploring the experience of indigenous women with customary law and national law. She has worked extensively in the past on exploring plural identities in Chiapas as well as the human rights of Guatemalan refugees in Mexico. She is the author of *Histories and Stories from Chiapas: Border Identities in Southern Mexico* (UT Press 2001) published also in Spanish as *La Otra Frontera: Identidades Múltiples en el Chiapas Postcolonial* (2001), and of *Etnografías e Historias de Resistencias*. She is recipient of the Martin Diskin Oxfam Award for her activist research.

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
