Her research focuses on Iroquois agriculture, knowledge, and the productivity of Indigenous cropping systems. She examines Iroquois agriculture from a multi-disciplinary perspective that includes history, archeology, paleobotany, and cultural/social anthropology in order to provide a critically needed bridge between scholars in the humanities and social sciences who work in Iroquois Studies.
